Introduction

The CAR T Vision is a coalition of cross-sector experts, working to ensure that every eligible patient gets the opportunity for cure with CAR T-cell therapy. By 2030 we aim to double the proportion of eligible patients treated with CAR T-cell therapy.

To translate the 2030 ambition to action, the coalition developed a [**CAR T Vision to Action Blueprint**](#) – a practical, expert-informed plan that stakeholder can adopt to enhance the knowledge, capacity, resources, and financial viability needed to expand and sustain the delivery of CAR T-cell therapy.

Purpose of this toolkit

To support implementation of the Blueprint, this toolkit is designed help stakeholders identify priority actions, engage relevant partners, and develop locally tailored plans to increase patient access to CAR T-cell therapy. The toolkit will be updated as the Vision evolves over time.

Who should use this toolkit

Anyone within the CAR T-cell therapy community, including patient advocates, patient organizations, healthcare professionals or professional societies, health system leaders and planners, policymakers and practitioners, policy think tanks, and academia and payor groups.

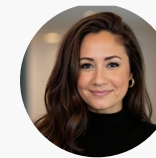

Double the proportion of eligible patients treated with CAR T-cell therapy by 2030


Vision goals


Increase awareness and understanding of CAR T-cell therapy


Expand resources and capacity to deliver CAR T-cell therapy

Develop sustainable and innovative financing approaches to manage the costs of treatment and care

Challenges to address

- Limited knowledge or experience of CAR T-cell therapy among some HCPs 
- HCP reservations in referring patients for CAR T-cell therapy
- Patient reservations around the safety profile and efficacy of CAR T-cell therapy
- Identifying eligible patients

- Treatment delivery limited to large, accredited treatment centers 
- Referral challenges and inefficiency of referral networks
- Delays between referral and commencement of treatment
- Staffing and resource challenges within treatment centers

- Existing reimbursement frameworks limit access to CAR T-cell therapy 
- Delays between reimbursement and patient access
- Payor reimbursement does not always cover the full cost of CAR T-cell therapy and care, leaving institutions exposed to costs of related hospitalization and support

Financial approaches to manage the costs of treatment and care for CAR T-cell therapy



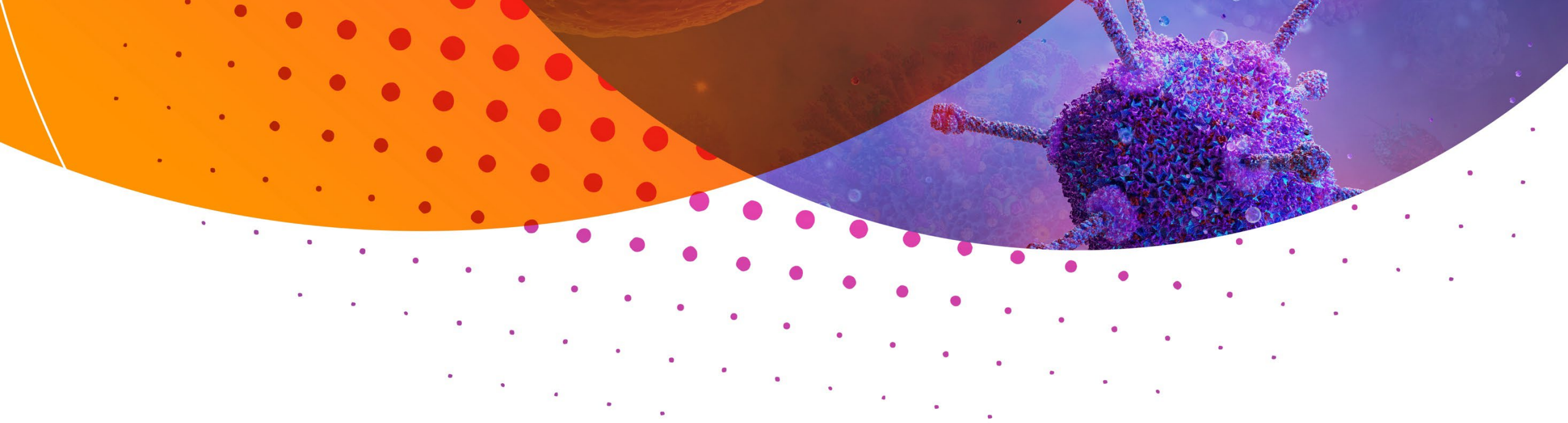
How to make the global Vision a local reality

- 3 Measure progress to assess improvement in practice and where further action is needed**

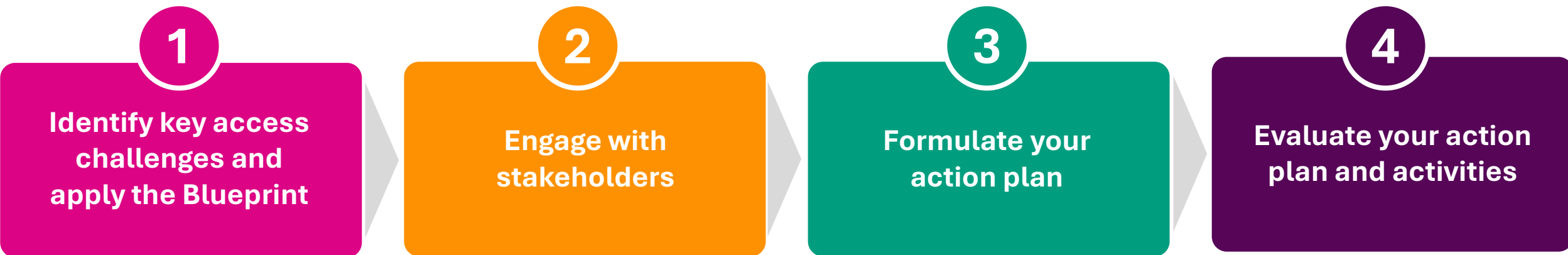


How to create a local action plan using the Vision to Action Blueprint

From Vision to Action: developing your local CAR T action plan

This step-by-step guide is intended as general guidance rather than a prescriptive model.

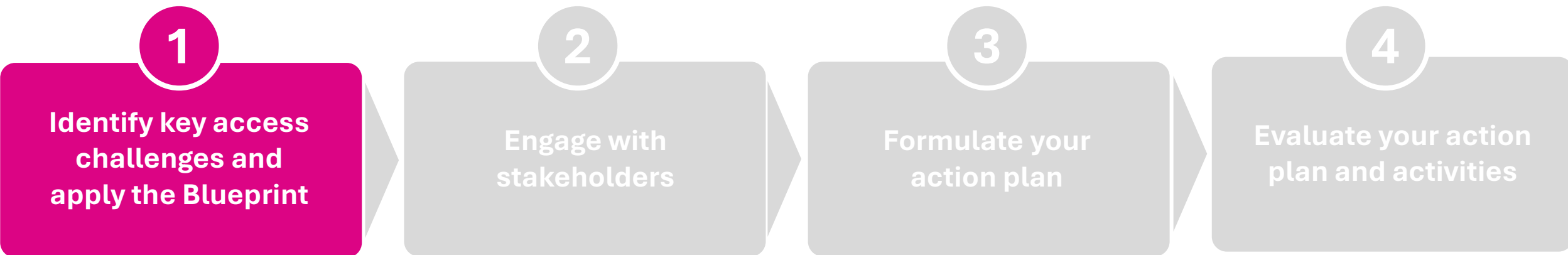
It offers a flexible process to support the development of an action plan – from identifying the key challenges and shaping actionable solutions, to planning for implementation and measuring overall progress.



Identify access challenges and apply the Blueprint

Using the **CART Vision to Action Blueprint**, this step helps identify the main access challenges and explores potential actions.

Define the key challenges to CAR T access

Answer the questions below to reflect and identify priority challenges that require action to improve access.

What?

- What is the main problem around access to CAR T-cell therapy?
- What does the problem stem from (e.g., lack of awareness and understanding, problems with capacity and funding streams)?

Who?

- Who does the problem affect? Are some groups more impacted than others?
- Who is currently working to address this problem?

Where?

- Where is the problem most significant?
- Where is progress already being made, and what additional actions are needed to overcome the key challenge(s)?

Why?

- Why is this issue occurring?
- Why has the occurring issue not been addressed?

Apply the Vision to Action Blueprint



▶ **Assess** available data, if any, to understand the extent and causes of the challenges.

▶ **Explore** the Blueprint and identify which Vision goal and corresponding actions could be relevant to overcome the challenges.

▶ **Consider** which actions could be most achievable, based on local context, policies, and stakeholder interests.

▶ **Learn** from the case studies to inform specific actions that you could take.

Engage with stakeholders

Consult with stakeholders across the community to gather diverse insights and perspectives. Their input can help refine your understanding of the key challenges, strengthen proposed actions, and secure support in developing and implementing your action plan.

Build a coalition

Questions to consider before creating your action plan

Component	Questions
Activity	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• What needs to be done to bring together stakeholders to take action?• What activities can help bring about change?
Timeline	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• When will you implement or conduct the activity?• What is the duration?• Are there multiple phases, or is it a pilot?
Resources	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• What resources (e.g., financial, people expertise, logistics) do you need to support the activity?• Do you have the right mix of skillsets and expertise needed to successfully implement the activity?• What content or materials will need to be created?• Where will the activities be implemented (e.g., geography, setting, platform)?• How can you secure these resources?
Stakeholders	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Who is the key target audience of your activity? Where are they?• Who is involved in executing the activity? What are their roles?• Who can facilitate implementation and help ensure success?
Risk mitigation	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Do you foresee any barriers to success?• Any plans in place to mitigate such risks?

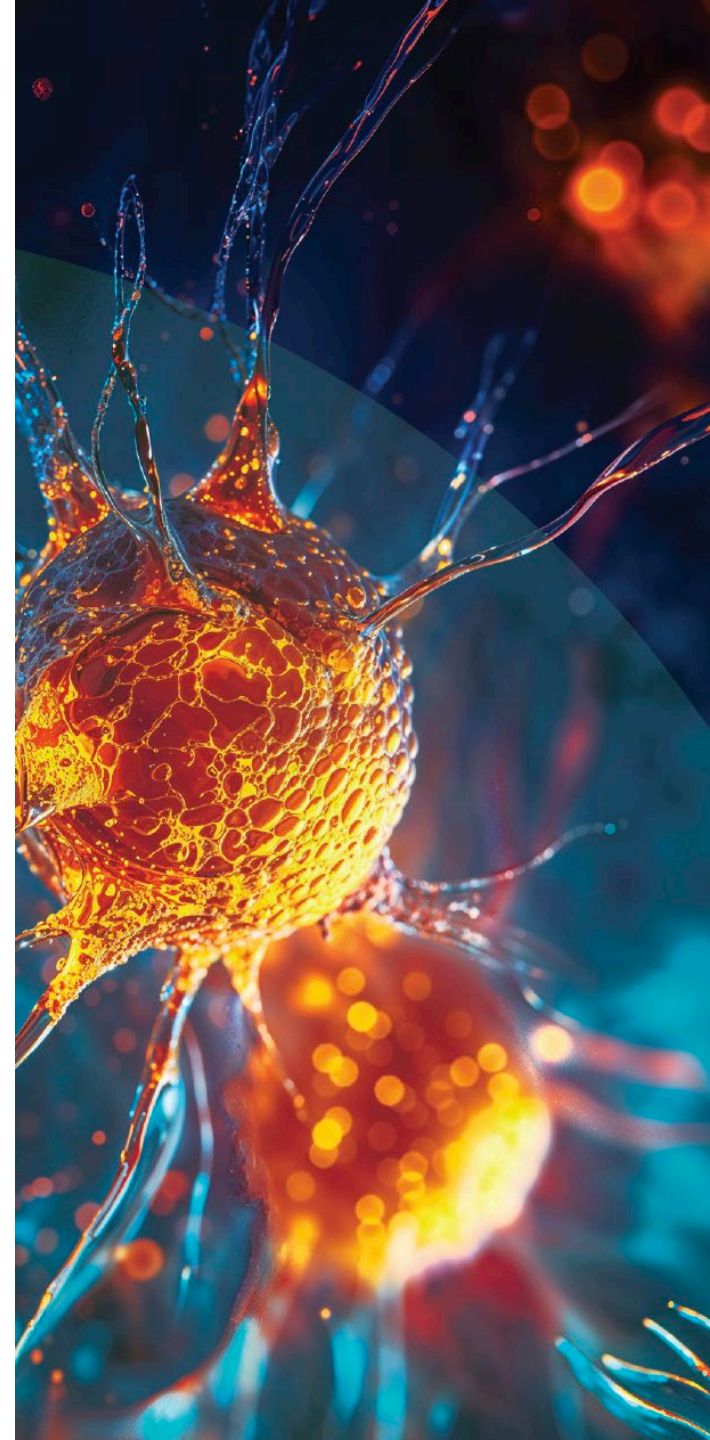
